Nature of support & Curriculum Focus 2012-13

At St. Patrick's we have a clear philosophy that we want to ensure none of our children suffer disadvantage in their learning opportunities. Through use of the Pupil Premium grant, we have subsidised workshops and projects involving visiting of professionals (Music, MFL, Performing Arts) and visits (including residential) to places of interest to give children a range of experiences and enhance their learning experiences.

Through the use of PP, we have targeted children we know have limited ICT capabilities at home, due to economic circumstances, to ensure they have increased ICT access in school to mobile devices, computer club etc., to redress these possible inequalities.

Early support strategies for those who need additional help in reading and number have also been partially funded through the pupil premium.

Our extensive range of opportunities beyond the school day enhance children's development and redress disadvantage. The grant has contributed towards the cost of these activities (eg. Computer club, music tuition, newspaper club, photography club).
