Nature of support & Curriculum Focus 2013-14

- At St. Patrick's we have a clear philosophy that we want to ensure none of our children suffer disadvantage in their learning opportunities.
- A) We use Pupil Premium grant to supplement carefully planned and targeted early intervention strategies for those who need additional help in reading and number. These interventions employ the skills of well trained and highly skilled practitioners. The training of these practitioners is also partly funded by PPG.
- B) We have also subsidised workshops and projects involving visiting of professionals (Music, MFL, Gardening, Performing Arts) and visits (including residential) to places of interest to give children a range of experiences, significantly enhance their learning experiences, and reduce barriers to learning. Leaning resources and the learning environment have also been significantly enhanced.

Through the use of PP, we have targeted children we know have limited ICT capabilities at home, due to economic circumstances, to ensure they have increased ICT access in school to mobile devices, computer club etc., to redress these possible inequalities.

Our extensive range of opportunities within and beyond the school day redress disadvantage by enhancing children's health, development and learning skills. The grant has contributed towards the cost of many of these activities (eg. computer, music tuition, newspaper, foreign languages, eco/science and photography clubs).
