<u>Year 2</u> <u>Autumn Curriculum Map</u>

<u>Subject</u>	What we will learn	Resources, trips, visitors & ideas
English	In the Autumn term, we will read "The Night Gardener" using the text to develop our ability to write narratives based on a known text and write in role with letters. We will also be reading 'The Bog Baby" and use the book to help us extend vocabulary and language, develop character descriptions and write finding stories about unusual creatures. This text will also inspire us to write instructions about how to look after an usual creature. In our English basic skills, we will be: Writing sentences with different forms: statement, question, exclamation, command. Using expanded noun phrases for description and specification [for example, the blue butterfly, plain flour, the man in the moon, etc.]. Using the present and past tenses correctly and consistently including the progressive form [e.g. I am writing, I was running, etc.].	Ideas for the weekend: Going on an 'usual things" hunt in the park or a local forest. Where might the unusual things be hiding? Why? Trips: Visit Sefton Park Palmhouse. World Museum. Resources: Clay or PlayDoh to make an unusual character e.g. alien/bog baby etc.
Maths	Using some of the diagonal and horizontal strokes needed to join letters when writing. Count in steps of 2, 3, and 5 from 0, and in tens from any number, forward and backwards. Read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals and in words. Recognise the place value of each digit in a two-digit number (tens, ones). Identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations including the number line. During our basic skills sessions we will be practising: Number bonds to 10. Reading and writing numbers to at least 100 in numerals and in words. Using place value and number facts to solve Problems. Solving problems with addition and subtraction.	Ideas for the weekend: Shopping with parents - counting home many food items have been purchased/using money to work out the value of food items/adding and subtracting to find the right amount of money or change. Trips: Local shop Resources: Shopping items
Science	 Distinguish between an object and the material from which it is made. Identify and name a variety of everyday materials, including wood, plastic, glass, metal, water, and rock. Describe the simple physical properties of a variety of everyday materials. 	Ideas for the weekend: Making umbrellas for teddy bears using different materials and testing them to see how well they work using a bucket of water or a watering can. Trips: Imagine That! Resources: Different materials from home; balls, springs, balloons, string, straws.

	 Compare and group together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of their simple physical properties. Identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses. Find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.

History/Geography	The Great Fire of London In History, we will study The Great Fire of London, find out about events beyond living memory that are significant and use information to describe the past. At the Farm In Geography, we will: Explore what farms are and why they are important, investigate the features of a farm, discover how the seasons affect life on a farm, and research the differences between life in a town and life on a farm. We will also learn how to use a map and symbols to navigate around a farm.	Ideas for the weekend: If possible, go and see a firework display at the local park on Bonfire Night! Trips: Local Museum Resources: Pictures of fireworks and Bonfire Night Ideas for the weekend: If possible, go and visit a local farm or look at pictures of farms and farm animals. Trips: Farms Resources: Farm small play animals. Maps of farms with keys.
Art/DT	Art - Portraits In Art, we will make portraits in the style of Pablo Picasso. Children will learn how to create a piece of art in response to the work of another artist and suggest how artists have used colour, pattern and shape. Children will show facial expressions in their art and choose tools and materials and explain why they have chosen them and what went well with their work.	Ideas for the weekend: Practice creating self-portraits with chalk, oil pastel, pencils, charcoal. Trips: Local art gallery - Walker Art Gallery/TATE. Resources: Pencils, oil pastels, chalk, charcoal.

	<u>DT - Movable Christmas Cards</u> In Design and Technology children will design a moveable dinosaur toy looking at features it requires and how toys move. They will also evaluate their own work to see if they need to make improvements.	Ideas for the weekend: Looking at moveable cards at home and discussing how they move and what makes them appealing to you. Trips: Card shop. Resources: Card, glue, scissors, stencils, craft materials.
PE	During this topic children will learn to compose and perform dance phrases. Children will explore, remember, repeat and link a range of actions with coordination, control, and an awareness of the expressive qualities of the dance. This term, the children will also develop their agility and basketball skills with Mersey Mavericks.	Ideas for the weekend: As much exercise, as possible! Lots of trips to the park etc. Trips: Dance classes/competitions Resources: Ribbons, materials, music.
Music	In Music this term we will be practising: Hands, Feet, Heart - Singing and performing Christmas Production - South African styles Glockenspiels Children will identify different ways sounds can be made and changed, use and choose sounds confidently in response to a stimulus, recognise and control how sounds can be made louder, quieter, faster and slower. They will also choose sounds and instruments and suggest how they should be used and played.	Ideas for the weekend: Making music out of instruments made from natural objects. Trips: Musicals/Philharmonic Resources: Instruments made from natural objects.
PSHE	In PSHE this term we will recognise, reflect on and respond to our own and others' health and wellbeing. We will be talking about how to have healthy bodies and healthy minds and how to ensure we build and maintain long lasting friendships. We will also be discussing and exploring citizenship skills.	Ideas for the weekend: Discuss how important friendships are and how we can maintain strong and stable friendships. Trips: Friends' houses, local park. Resources: N/A
Spanish	In Spanish, we will be learning about: Greetings, numbers 0-60, personal questions, colours, Countries, body parts, days of the week, animals ¿Tienes un animal? Negative "La viejita" and the Christmas song "El juego chirimbolo.	Ideas for the weekend: Singing Spanish songs. Practicing numbers to 100 in Spanish. Trips: Spanish food shops. Resources: Spanish words, numbers or phrases
Computing/ E-safety	In e-safety this term, we will focus on internet safety and our digital footprint & reputation. Pupils will discuss criteria for choosing appropriate websites and avoiding unsuitable ones and apply them to an assigned site. Pupils will learn that not everything is completed deleted online and will manage their digital footprint accordingly. We will also be using Digital Photography in our Autumn geography topic, and English topic.	Ideas for the weekend: Talking about how to stay safe on the internet. Trips: Apple store Resources: iPads.
