Trips: 1km walk around our local area. Resources: 2d and 3d shapes from around the home. Let your children play with and use real coins.
Science	Living things and their habitats The children will be focusing on skills of data collection and analysis, where they will explore their collected results on a deeper level and be able to give reasons with regards to their findings. Evolution and inheritance We will be studying how animals adapt to their environment looking at reasons for these adaptations.	Ideas for the weekend: Homework project - building an ideal home for an animal Trips: Liverpool life science centre
Geography	Extreme Earth We will study the extreme weather conditions from around the world looking at tornadoes, hurricanes and storms. We will also study natural disasters including volcanoes, earthquakes and tsunamis.	Ideas for the weekend: Watch the weather forecast and bbc newsround - discuss any natural disasters around the world.
History	Britain since 1948 Pupils will examine different sources of information, looking at primary and secondary sources and what we can glean from them. We will move onto to look at the different decades individually and what significant events occurred and how life changed during that particular decade.	Ideas for the weekend: Visit Liverpool Museum. Look at Beatles related history. Trips: Visit to Liverpool Life Museum
ICT/ Computing	Text adventures Children will use their knowledge of coding to plan, create and evaluate a text based adventure using 2Create a Story, 2Code and 2 Connect. Networks Children will learn about the internet and the World Wide Web and will develop an understanding of the school network. We will focus our studies on Tim Berners-Lee and will study some of the developments in technology which have taken place over the last 50 years.	Ideas for the weekend: Allow children time to log into their PurpleMash account and try some coding independently.
E safety	Privacy settings Pupils learn that children's websites must protect their private information. They learn to identify these secure sites by looking for their privacy policies and privacy seals of approval. Cyber bullying / relationships and communication Pupils explore how it feels to be cyberbullied, how cyberbullying is similar to or different than in-person bullying, and learn strategies for handling cyberbullying when it arises.	Ideas for the weekend: Research social media platforms and their privacy / security settings. Discuss these in detail together.
Art	Exploring patterns in modern art - Pop Art (Andy Warhol) This term we will be looking at Andy Warhol and pop art. Children will digitally manipulating pictures of Liverpool. These pictures will be displayed in an art exhibition within school and the community will be invited to attend their exhibition. We will also do an element of digital art linking this to Pop art.	Ideas for the weekend: as a family, visit on of the art galleries in Liverpool. Resources: coloured card and scissors so children can create their own cut out art.
Design and	Burgers	Ideas for the weekend:



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Technology	The children will be designing burgers. As part of this topic the children will taste different ingredients, completing research to decide which burgers people prefer. As part of this topic the children will visit a restaurant to complete a tasting session.	Research the different types of burgers that are available. Ask family members what their favourite burgers are. Visit a restaurant and taste burgers.
PE	<p>Gymnastics This term the children will be learning gymnastics and building on what they have learnt in previous years. Year 6 are extremely good at gymnastics and I look forward to seeing how their skills have improved</p> <p>Swimming Children will go swimming for 45 minutes each Friday afternoon. They will be walking to the pool.
