Subject	Learning	Resources, Trips and Visitors
RE	<p>During summer term we will be studying three topics.</p> <p>Witness - during this topic the children will be able to make links to show how feelings and beliefs affect their behaviour and that of others. The children will focus on telling the truth and the power of the Holy Spirit during Pentecost and the affect Pentecost had on the disciples as witnesses.</p> <p>Reconciliation - during this topic the children will learn about the Commandments and how we should include these in how we live our lives. The children will focus on what happens when people become sick and need care. The children will also look at The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.</p> <p>World: Common good - during this topic the children will learn about fairness and justice for the good of all. We will look at how Christians help charities and how we can support such charities (CAFOD, Nugent) The children will examine how Jesus wants us to be fair and just in the way we live our lives.</p>	<p>Ideas for the weekend: Attend mass and speak to Father John about Pentecost. Attend reconciliation at your local church. Research the role of a deacon. Research local charities and ask school council whether we can fundraise.</p> <p>Trips: St Patrick's church, Cathedrals</p> <p>Resources: The Bible, www.misiontogether.org.uk</p>
English	<p>Riose Blanche (Roberto Innocenti). This book will be used to develop a bravery award speech and a diary.</p> <p>Shackleton's Journey (Willian Grill). This book will be used to write endurance narratives and a magazine article.</p>	<p>Ideas for the weekend: read magazine articles. Research, watch and read different speeches.</p>
Maths	<p>The majority of this term we will be focusing on statistics. We will be interrupting and constructing pie charts and line graphs and using these to solve problems. We will be focusing on calculating the mean as an average.</p> <p>Also this term, we will do a lot of revision on specific areas which we may have struggled with in the past.</p>	<p>Ideas for the weekend: plan a trip to the shops, work out how much you will need to spend and how much change you should receive.</p> <p>Trips: 1km walk around our local area.</p> <p>Resources: 2d and 3d shapes from around the home. Let your children play with and use real coins.</p>
Science	<p>Our new science topic this term is 'Animals including humans'. In this topic, we will look at the main parts of the human circulatory system and what the function of each of the parts and organs is. We will also study the impact of drugs on the way our body functions. Finally we will learn the way nutrients and water are transported within animals.</p>	<p>Ideas for the weekend: Homework project - building an ideal home for an animal (more detail and resources given in class)</p> <p>Trips: Liverpool life science centre</p>
Geography & History	<p>The children will be combining our geography and history skills. They will be looking at our local area and how the history and geography of Liverpool has supported its success since 1948. The children will complete a project for this topic looking at the different industries and what was happening historically and how this affected Liverpool.</p>	<p>Ideas for the weekend: Visit landmarks around Liverpool such as the River Mersey, The Three Graces, Use maps to navigate around the city.</p> <p>Resources: globe, maps of Liverpool and a map of the UK.</p>
ICT/ Computing	<p>As always, children will be using iPads across the curriculum to support and enhance their learning. 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<p>Design and Technology</p>	<p>Year 6 will spend time creating a St Patrick's memory textiles panel. We will be remembering our favourite things about our time in school and will look at the best way to represent these on a panel. <p>PE</p>	<p>This term the children will be learning athletics and the skills to improve their own performance. At the end of the term we will complete an intra school sports day and some inter school competitions. We will also be focusing on dance during the summer term with the Year 6 show as our final piece. <p>Music</p>	<p>Don't stop believing - Journey Children will listen to, appraise and sing the song Don't stop believing. <p>PSHCE</p>	<p>This term pupils will be looking at budgeting and generating incomes. The children will complete a careers carousel and spend time talking to employees from different industries about how they ended up within their industry. The children will also be preparing for secondary school and will be completing a transition programme with Thumbs up based on managing challenging situations and positive thinking. Also, as part of the PSHE programme the children will look at extremism and terrorist actions and identify possible ways that people can persuade young people to join gangs.
