English	<p>Jemmy Button - A return story and letters</p> <p>This is a retelling of a narrative that incorporates several elements of the main plot. The children will also continue to work on the year 3 objectives of: Inverted commas are introduced to demarcate speech. Adverbs to express time. Prepositions to express place</p> <p>Fox - Fable Narrative &amp; Persuasion</p> <p>This book gives the children lots of opportunities to write some poetry using similes based on the illustrations from the book. They will also plan their own fable narrative about a fox. The children also have the opportunity to write a piece of persuasive text about a fox after lots of research.</p>	<p><b>Ideas for the weekend</b> Encourage your child to read and enjoy books.</p> <p>Encourage children to find out facts about foxes and others animals.</p>

Let your children play with and use real coins.</p>
Science	<p>Animals including Humans - Year 3 children will firstly recap on what they know about invertebrate and vertebrates from year 2. Children will learn that animals, including humans, need the right types and amounts of nutrition, and recognise that animals cannot make their own food. They will learn that humans and some other animals have skeletons for support, protection and movement, and recognise that humans and some other animals have muscles for support, protection and movement.</p>	<p><b>Ideas for the weekend :</b> Do some exercise to strengthen your muscles as a family.</p>
Geography & History	<p>DESERTS- pupils will find out what deserts are and use map and globes to find where in the world they are located. They will also analyse data to investigate the weather and climate of deserts around the world.</p> <p><b>History - Invaders and Settlers: Romans-</b> pupils will find out how and why the Romans invaded Britain. They will also begin to understand the terms 'invade' and 'settle' and then place the Romans on a timeline.</p>	<p><b>Ideas for the weekend:</b> Visit landmarks around Liverpool such as the River Mersey,</p> <p><b>Resources:</b> globe, maps of Liverpool and a map of the UK.</p>
ICT/ Computing	<p>As always, children will be using iPads across the curriculum to support and enhance their learning. Specifically, they will be learning about how to write a code to move an object.</p> <p>Relationship &amp; communication - compare in-person and online communications and how to write clear, respectful messages online also the will be able to use effective communication via email - the purpose and audience applicable to their tone.</p> <p>E-Safety is taught every term, this term, children will be looking at the impact of the media</p>	<p><b>Ideas for the weekend:</b> make a PowerPoint with your child to show us what you got up to over half term.</p> <p><b>E-Safety</b> remind your children about not sharing information about themselves on games or anything else on the computer.</p>



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<b>Art</b>	This term we will be looking at Aboriginal art by Paul Klee – Year 3 children will explore styles, colours, symbols that are used, identifying some common Aboriginal symbols used and what they mean. The children will then get to create some of their own symbols for a variety of different words. At the end the children will create their own unique piece of artwork representing a particular journey.	<b>Ideas for the weekend:</b> as a family together draw or paint some aboriginal art. <b>Resources:</b> paints and paper to enable children to create their aboriginal symbols.
<b>Design and Technology</b>	Year 3 will be making lampshades and tie dying the material. Children will learn how to dye fabrics, applique and embellish using scissors, needle and thread and fabric glue. They then design their own lampshade based on their own design criteria, before making and evaluating their product.	<b>Ideas for the weekend:</b> Look at different textiles that you have in your home.
<b>PE</b>	Athletics This term the children will be learning all about athletics and the skills to improve their own performance..	<b>Ideas for the weekend:</b> as a family, go for a run and practice your different skills.  <b>Resources:</b> join your local Life Styles gym.
<b>Music</b>	Playing the recorder. Children will play the notes G, A, B, C and D on a recorder and perform pieces using 5 notes. They will compose simple pieces using 5 notes and perform them to the class. They will be encouraged to develop creativity by showing an ability to improvise. Children will recognise simple notation using the stave.	<b>Ideas for the weekend:</b> practise with their recorders <b>Resources:</b> Charanga Music World login
<b>PSHCE</b>	Internet safety PANTS Looking at how we change both physically, mentally and emotionally. Look at personal safety and the safety of others. Manage risk in everyday life. Extend strategies to cope with risky situations.
