The Art and Design curriculum at St. Patrick's Catholic Primary School will provide a varied, imaginative, innovative and co-ordinated series of lessons that will foster enthusiasm for art and design amongst all children across the key stages. The art programme will allow children to foster an enjoyment and appreciation of the visual arts and a knowledge of artists, craftspeople and designers, through links with the local and wider multi-cultural community. Using the Artsmark award criteria as guidance, we aim to stimulate children's creativity and imagination by providing visual, tactile and sensory experiences. We will help children to explore the world at first hand, using all their senses and experimentation, and so gain knowledge and understanding of the world in which they live. Children will begin to develop an understanding of colour, form, texture, pattern and they will use materials, tools and processes to communicate ideas, feelings and meanings. The art programme will inspire confidence, value and pleasure in being creative and encourage children to express their feelings about their own artwork and others in a constructive and evaluative way. Through the Art and Design curriculum children will be able to respond critically and imaginatively to ideas, images and objects as well as artwork from famous artists and sculptors past and present.
