(RSHE) is taught both discretely and within the Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE) curriculum lessons. Some aspects of the RSHE curriculum may be touched upon in other lessons as it shares links with Religious Education, Science, Computing and Physical Education. Our RSHE will ensure that content is relevant to the age, experience and maturity of pupils. The new statutory guidance for Relationships education focuses on teaching the fundamental building blocks and characteristics of positive relationships including: Families and people who care for me, caring friendships, respectful relationships, online relationships and being safe. It is compulsory to teach RSHE.

Lateness - After half term, if your child **arrives after 8:45**, you must take them to the **bottom gate by the church**. School gates open between 8:30 and 8:45 this is plenty of time to get your children in. By arriving late staff are having to leave their classrooms to open the gate and this is taking teaching time away from the other children who have arrived on time. We urge you to get your child in to school on time. By doing this you are preparing them for the future.

COVID Testing - School continues to follow government guidelines.

- If your child has symptoms (high temperature, a new, continuous cough, and a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste).
- If you have symptoms, they must get a **PCR** test - a lateral flow (quick) test is not enough.
- If anyone has symptoms, everyone in the house must stay at home.
- Please **wear a face covering and social distance** when dropping off and collecting your child. This keeps us and other families safe
- If any of the children, your family become symptomatic over the weekend or test positive.
