Maths	In Year 6, we will be finishing off our fractions and percentages work. We will be looking at finding percentages of amounts, including real life examples such as sales. We will study measurement, carrying out calculations involving measure and convert between measures (including distance, weight and time). We will study shape calculating their perimeter and area (shapes including square, rectangle, triangle, parallelograms). We will also look at the diameter and circumference of circles and study angles within regular polygons. Finally, we will finish with our position and direction, looking at co-ordinates, translation and reflection of shapes across a four quadrant grid.	Ideas for the weekend: to the shops, work out how much you will need to spend and how much change you should receive.Trips: 1km walk around our local area.Resources: 2d and 3d shapes from around the home. Let your children play with and use real coins.
Science	Living things and their habitats The children will be focusing on skills of data collection and analysis, where they will explore their collected results on a deeper level and be able to give reasons with regards to their findings. Evolution and inheritance We will be studying how animals adapt to their environment looking at reasons for these adaptations.	<u>Ideas for the weekend:</u> Homework project - building an ideal home for an animal <u>Trips:</u> Liverpool life science centre
Geography	<b>Extreme Earth</b> We will study the extreme weather conditions from around the world looking at tornadoes, hurricanes and storms. We will also study natural disasters including volcanoes, earthquakes and tsunamis.	Ideas for the weekend: Watch the weather forecast and bbc newsround - discuss any natural disasters around the world.
History	<b>Britain since 1948</b> Pupils will examine different sources of information, looking at primary and secondary sources and what we can gleam from them. We will move onto to look at the different decades individually and what significant events occurred and how life changed during that particular decade.	<u>Ideas for the weekend:</u> Visit Liverpool Museum. Look at Beatles related history. <u>Trips:</u> Visit to Liverpool Life Museum
ICT/ Computing	Coding Children will use their knowledge of coding to plan, create and evaluate a coded programme based adventure using 2Create a Story, 2Code and 2 Connect. Networks Children will learn about the internet and the World Wide Web and will develop an understanding of the school network. We will focus our studies on Tim Berners- Lee and will study some of the developments in technology which have taken place over the last 50 years.	<b>Ideas for the weekend:</b> Allow children time to log into their PurpleMash account and try some coding independently.
