Subject	Learning	Resources, Trips and Visitors
<b>RE</b>	During summer term we will be studying three topics. Pentecost – serving children will questions about their own and others' experiences and feelings about the power of fire and wind and how this energy can be used for good. Reconciliation – choices – children will learn all about how choice have consequences and how to make the right choices	<u>Ideas for the weekend:</u> Attend mass and speak to Father Siluvio about Pentecost. Attend reconciliation at your local church. Research local charities and ask school council whether we can fundraise. <u>Trips:</u> St Patrick's church, Cathedrals <u>Resources:</u> The Bible,
<b>English</b>	Jemmy Button – A return story and letters This is a retelling of a narrative that incorporates several elements of the main plot. The children will also continue to work on the year 3 objectives of: Inverted commas are introduced to demarcate speech. Adverbs to express time. Prepositions to express place  Fox – fable narrative – persuasion	<u>Ideas for the weekend</u> Encourage your child to read and enjoy books.
<b>Maths</b>	Statistics- Year 3 children will interpret and present data using bar charts, pictograms and tables solve one-step and two-step questions [for example 'How many more?' and 'How many fewer?'] using information presented in scaled bar charts and pictograms and tables  Geometry- shapes and angles  Measurements- millimetres centimetres – metres – grams – kilograms – millilitres – litres –	<u>Ideas for the weekend:</u> plan a trip to the shops, work out how much you will need to spend and how much change you should receive. <u>Trips:</u> 1km walk around our local area. <u>Resources:</u> 2d and 3d shapes from around the home. Let your children play with and use real coins.
<b>Science</b>	Animals including humans- understanding that plants and animal needs basic things to survive. Plants – looking at how plants survive.	
<b>Geography</b>	DESERTS- pupils will find out what deserts are and use map and globes to find where in the world they are located. They will also analyse data to investigate the weather and climate of deserts around the world.	<u>Resources:</u> globe, maps of Liverpool and a map of the UK.  <u>Ideas for the weekend:</u> Visit landmarks around Liverpool such as the River Mersey,
<b>History</b>	History – Invaders and Settlers: Romans- pupils will find out how and why the Romans invaded Britain. They will also begin to understand the terms 'invade' and 'settle' and then place the Romans on a timeline	
<b>ICT/ Computing</b>	As always, children will be using iPads across the curriculum to support and enhance their learning. Specifically, they will be learning about how to write a code to move an object. In computing, children will be using Purple Mash (2 code) which allows students to develop programming skills and explore the world of automatic, autonomous systems and robots. E-Safety is taught every term, this term, children will be looking at the impact of the media	<u>Ideas for the weekend:</u> make a PowerPoint with your child to show us what you got up to over half term.  E-Safety remind your children about not sharing information about themselves on games or anything else on the computer.
<b>Art</b>	This term we will be looking at Aboriginal Art – Paul Klee – repeated patterns. We will generate our own ideas and recreate and design our own piece of repeated pattern. Taking ourselves on a journey and showing the journey within our art work.	<u>Ideas for the weekend:</u> as a family, visit on of the art galleries in Liverpool. <u>Resources:</u> coloured card and scissors so children can create their repeated patterns.
<b>Design and Technology</b>	Year 3 will be making lampshades and tie dying the material. Children will learn how to dye fabrics, applique and embellish using scissors, needle and thread and fabric glue. They then design their own lampshade based on their own design criteria, before making and evaluating their product.	<u>Ideas for the weekend:</u> Look at different textiles that you have in your home.
<b>PE</b>	Netball – sending and receiving a ball accurately in a variety of ways. This term the children will be learning all about athletics and the skills to improve their own performance..	<u>Ideas for the weekend:</u> as a family, go for a run and practice your different skills.



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	Tennis- Take up a good position and strike a ball with accuracy. Get into a good position to hit the ball after one bounce.	<u>Resources:</u> join your local Life Styles gym.
<b>Music</b>	Playing the recorder. Children will play the notes G, A, B, C and D on a recorder and perform pieces using 5 notes. They will compose simple pieces using 5 notes and perform them to the class. They will be encouraged to develop creativity by showing an ability to improvise. Children will recognise simple notation using the stave.	<u>Ideas for the weekend:</u> practise with their recorders <u>Resources:</u> Charanga Music World login
<b>PSHCE</b>	Internet safety PANTS Looking at how we change both physically, mentally and emotionally. Look at personal safety and the safety of others. Manage risk in everyday life. Extend strategies to cope with risky situations. Learn how to behave safely and responsibly in different situations.	<u>Ideas for the weekend:</u> Make lists of all the positive experiences that you have had over the weekend and be thankful.
<b>Spanish</b>	Children will learn numbers 0-100, including doubling and halving. They will talk about kitchen objects and sing the song ♪"Soy una taza". Children will learn further vocabulary relating to animals and fruits, and will read the story "El Secreto".	<u>Ideas for the weekend:</u>
