#### Personal, Social and Emotional Development

#### **Physical Development**

### Phonics

- Playing with words and sounds through songs, rhymes and listening games.
- Say some of the words in songs and rhymes.
- Develop phonological knowledge, rhyme, rhythm, including using percussion instruments.
- Listening to the sounds in our environment and identifying them.
- Begin to learn the first set of sounds in our phonics scheme, (N2's)

## Communication and Language

- Learning how to listen carefully and why listening is important.
- Listening carefully to and talking about stories, rhymes and • songs, showing familiarity and understanding.
- Using our manners throughout the day and at snack time. •
- Using new vocabulary throughout the day. •
- Holding conversations with an adult or a friend.
- Using language to recreate roles and experiences in play.
- Be able to tell a long story. •
- Vocabulary is at the heart of everything we do -giving children the words to express themselves effectively.

# Literacy

- Giving meaning to mark-making in a wide range of activities.
- Learning a range of nursery rhymes.
- Learning about fairy tale characters such as Little Red Riding • Hood.
- Learning through traditional tales.
- Sharing and retelling familiar stories, developing new vocabulary, story language and a love of books.
- Write some or all of their name (N2'5)
- Write some letters accurately •
